Attract Attention: 20 Points- Use of Color, Motion, Light, Figures, Etc
Arouses Interest: 10 Points- Encourages additional study. Personal appeal to the type of viewer for whom the exhibit was designed.

Conveys Message: 30 Points- The message should be understandable to the viewer for whom the exhibit was intended.

Design: 20 Points- Elements of the exhibit should be pleasingly placed to give a sense of unit to the whole. The message should be a part of the design.

Workmanship: 10 Points- Neat, well-constructed for the purpose.
Originality: 10 Points
